Grant Lai, a local from Irvine, admitted that chemistry wasn't initially on his radar during his high school years. Grant enrolled at UC Irvine as a Biomedical Engineering major, but soon discovered that the mathematical demands of the program were more than he had anticipated. In search of an alternative, he considered biology and added chemistry as a second choice. To his surprise, Grant found himself drawn to chemistry as he delved deeper into the subject. What started as a stepping stone became a genuine passion, leading him to pursue a double major in Biological Sciences and Chemistry.

Grant's immediate academic plans involve pursuing a prestigious opportunity at the University of Cambridge. He has been awarded the Churchill Scholarship, which will allow him to spend a year at Cambridge earning a Master of Philosophy in Chemistry. Looking beyond his time at Cambridge, Grant aims to enroll in an MD-PhD program. He envisions using his expertise in chemical biology to contribute to the medical field, with an interest in infectious diseases. Grant acknowledges that his interests may evolve as he progresses in his studies and research.

Grant's involvement at UC Irvine is centered around two main areas: the Chemistry Club at UCI and undergraduate research. As a sophomore, Grant and his friends played a pivotal role in reviving the Chemistry Club at UCI, which had previously become inactive. Transforming it into a thriving "academic social club" that welcomes anyone interested in chemistry. Grant served as the club's president from its refounding until the beginning of his senior year. He takes pride in the club's continued success after his leadership, viewing it as a sign of the organization's health and sustainability. The club has become a "home away from home" for chemistry enthusiasts, fulfilling Grant's desire to create a sense of community within the large university setting. In addition, Grant is an undergraduate research assistant with the Nowick Research Group focusing on chemistry and biology of peptides.

Upon receiving the Distinguished Anteater Award, Grant felt both excited and surprised, given the competitive nature of alumni scholarships. The award has significantly impacted his UC Irvine experience by providing crucial financial support. The scholarship has allowed him to redirect funds towards career-advancing goals, reducing financial stress and enabling greater focus on his studies and research. Beyond the monetary benefits, the award has served as a motivating recognition of Grant's academic achievements, further fueling his dedication to his educational journey at UC Irvine.

UCI Center for Black Cultures, Resources, and Research

The Center for Black Cultures, Resources, and Research's (CBCRR) primary focus is to assist students in successfully navigating their college experience and supporting the academic success of Black students. The CBCRR aims to fill gaps that may exist between the resources provided by the university and the specific needs of Black students. The CBCRR offers academic advising, support services, and professional development to prepare students for college life and future careers. The center's future goals include expanding its physical space to accommodate more students and addressing the financial squeeze on middle-class students. Overall, the center's ultimate goal is to help students acclimate to the university environment and breaking down the potentially intimidating aspects of a large institution into manageable parts.



















Resources & Services

- <u>Laptop Sharing Services</u>: The Center offers both short-term and long-term laptop loans to students. The center has about 15 Macs and 10 PCs available for loan. Students initially receive short-term loans and can request a longer-term loan with professional staff. For longer loans, students sign a contract assuming responsibility for replacement if the laptop is lost or damaged.
- <u>Free Unlimited Printing</u>: Free unlimited printing services for students needing access to printers. This service has become a significant draw for students to use the center and help reduce their educational costs.
- LARC Scholarships: The center offers scholarships to help students access tutorial services without financial burden. Students may have their entire \$125 tutorial fee covered. primarily offered to first-year students and those in challenging majors like Biological Sciences.
- <u>Counselor-in-Residence Drop-In Hours</u>: Led by Dr. Diaz, Director of the UCI Counseling Center, to support students' mental health-related topics.
- <u>Drop-in Academic Counseling & Advising Services</u>: Led by two academic advisors who advise Undergraduate/Undeclared students on a quarterly basis regarding course selection, majors, and general education requirements for second-year plus students.

SISTA CIRCLE

A support group for womxn of the Black/African diaspora at UCI, empowering women of color through mutual support, education, and awareness about physical and mental health. Drawing on Black community traditions, the group provides a space for authentic self-expression and celebration of identity, fostering strength and solidarity among its members.



WABRUDA: MEN'S GROUP

A support group for men of the Black/African diaspora, aimed at educating and empowering young Black men through positive role models and leadership. Open to faculty, staff, and students, the group strives to improve quality of life and enhance educational and economic opportunities for the African Diaspora community.


From May 1st-31st, incoming students have the opportunity to apply to our campuswide scholarships that can range from need or meritbased, various award amounts, and different eligibility requirements.
